I am an organic/bio-dynamic goat farmer.

This is a family farm, run by me and my wife Marielle. Our two sons of 16 and 19 participate in the farming.

We have 150 goats on the farm. We produce about 110.000 liter of <u>milk</u>. Of this, we deliver 65.000lt to the cooperative Tine, we make <u>cheese</u> ourselves of about 35.000 liter. About 10.000 liter goes to feed the small goat lambs. Some of them are for replacement in the herd, most of them are slaughtered



at about 6 weeks. We also make <u>sausage</u> / <u>salami</u> at the farm from goats that are 1 - 4 years old. We sell cheese, fresh goat lamb meat and goat sausage from our farm shop and deliver to restaurants and shops.

We are member of the Norwegian small farmers association (Norsk bonde og småbrukerlag). Marielle is a board member of this organization, and she is a member of the CC in the ECVC (Via Campesina)

are young families and we succeeded to develop pretty good farming and selling in short chain supply, we believe that that would be attractive for many other small family farms to imitate us and to start using "holistic management". Mentioned would have great impact on soil regeneration and climate changes together with rural restoration. Although we already have established many parts of our production, and we have growing market in whole Croatia, we need to develop our farms more quickly our (in holistic way). That is on my opinion tricky part for many farms because there is lot of money invested in programs of education but not so much invested in farms. I hope that with BOND project that will change since BOND includes networking and connecting many different points. I would like to be point of such knowledge transfer to students of faculty of Agriculture, since I am working there, to have strong example of how can organic (but holistic and biodynamic) production be successful (you can live from that), because most people in Croatia have strong mindset that that is impossible (people on Faculties too).
