Market Cooperative CUMAs are farm machinery service cooperatives, small autonomous groups, ruled by and for farmers. Their objective is collective investment and joint use of machinery, buildings, infrastructure and workers. By pooling equipment, CUMA offer an innovative arrangement to share equipment, reduce machinery costs and make limited capital available for other uses. In the case of CUMA Nord'Oignon, the shared investment is in all the equipment required for the sorting, grading, drying and packaging of onions. This group has been created by 9 producers in 1991 as they needed to respond to market demands in terms of products they were supplying. Now 30 farmers are members of the CUMA, included 10 organic producers. As onion is a speculative crop, it was quite difficult to gather people together for a collective project - the president recognizes that it took them 10 years to find the right way to operate! Success means that more framers regularly request to join the group. The sale of the onions is the task of another linked cooperative, Marché de Phalempin. Marché de Phalempin is a cooperative dedicated to the sales of fresh vegetables from 188 producers. It has an agreement with the CUMA Nord'Oignon : to sell all the onions of the CUMA members, and only them, and to provide market feedback to the producers. This cooperative sells around 40 000 tons of vegetables produced by local farmers, 80% is sold to supermarkets.
